KIPP BOLD students have collegeprep instruction, a safe and supportive learning environment, caring teachers, extracurriculars, monthly trips and more!

ABOUT KIPP NEWARK

KIPP Newark schools are part of the nationally recognized "Knowledge Is Power Program" nonprofit network of college preparatory, public charter schools educating elementary, middle, and high school students. In 2002, 80 fifth graders walked through the doors of our first middle school in Newark, New Jersey. KIPP Newark has since grown to teach over 6,000 students in grades K-12 across 12 schools in Newark. Eightyeight percent of KIPP Newark students currently qualify for free or reduced meals.

KIPP Newark alumni earn college degrees at more than three times the national average compared to their peers. By offering highly effective educators with strong bonds to families, more time in school learning, services that support a variety of student needs, and a culture focused on achievement, our students are on the path to and through college, career, and beyond.

WHAT MAKES KIPP BOLD ACADEMY UNIQUE?

STUDENT LEADERS

BOLDsters learn to use their voice and stand up for what's right. In performing arts class students develop speaking skills and presence, in academic classes students debate with their peers, and at all times scholars take pride in the success of their school.

EXPANDING OUR HORIZONS

BOLDsters get to explore the world around them through overnight field trips and activities after school. BOLDsters become tough competitors through our athletics program and develop their talents through exposure to the arts.

TECHNOLOGY

Every BOLD student has his or her own laptop to use throughout the day. Teachers prepare students for careers of the future by incorporating technology skills into their teaching and meeting the needs of individual learners through computer learning programs.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

BOLD students aren't just brilliant and hardworking, they're dedicated to giving back to their community. BOLDsters participate in service learning experiences and extracurricular activities that stress helping others. Scholars learn more about their hometown through our partnerships with NJPAC and NJSO.

RESULTS THAT MATTER

Though we focus on character, our students also receive an education that prepares them for college and beyond. In 2019, Mathematica released a study

showing that the impact of attending a KIPP middle school could erase the racial achievement gap in four-year college enrollment rates nationwide -- attending KIPP following a middle school lottery produced an increase of 12.9 percentage points in enrollment rates in four-year college programs.

TO AND THROUGH COLLEGE, CAREER, AND BEYOND

With 74% of our 8th graders matriculating to college, we have created support structures to make sure they get the rest of the way through.
