ABOUT KIPP SPARK ACADEMY

Located in Newark's central ward, SPARK Academy was founded in 2009 with 100 kindergartners. Since then, SPARK has grown to educate over 700 students in grades K-4. Upon completion of elementary school, many SPARK fourth graders have the option of moving onto to one of our four Newark middle schools.

ABOUT KIPP NEWARK

KIPP Newark schools are part of the nationally recognized "Knowledge Is Power Program" non-profit network of college preparatory, public charter schools educating elementary, middle, and high school students. In 2002, 80 fifth graders walked through the doors of

our first middle school in Newark, New Jersey. KIPP Newark has since grown to teach 6,321 students in grades K-12 across 12 schools in Newark. Ninety of KIPP Newark students currently qualify for free or reduced meals.

KIPP Newark alumni earn college degrees at more than three times the national average compared to their peers. By offering highly effective educators with strong bonds to families, more time in school learning, services that support a variety of student needs, and a culture focused on achievement, our students are on the path to and through college, career, and beyond.

WHAT MAKES KIPP SPARK ACADEMY UNIQUE?

WE ARE NEWARK, NEW JERSEY

SPARKsters learn early and often to leave a place better than they found it, and that applies to Newark as much as the hallway in their school. Through service learning projects and character education, they learn to be the change in our city.

TEAM AND FAMILY

We work in partnership with families to support student growth: Families should expect a response to an inquiry from their teacher within 24 hours and have the chance to participate in family focused events throughout the year. There's

also a family association of parent volunteers committed to strengthening the partnership between scholars, the school, and the community.

SUPPORT FROM KINDERGARTEN TO COLLEGE & CAREER

From day one, students are on a path to college or a career of their choice. Classrooms at SPARK are named after colleges, grade levels are named after the year kids go to college, and students visit and learn about colleges throughout the year.



HOW ARE STUDENTS PROGRESSING?

OUR CURRICULUM

Our elementary schools implement curriculum literacy programs that support reading engagement and growth. In grades K-2, we offer the highly-ranked Magnetic Reading Foundations. Students in grades 3-4 are offered a program called Phonics for Reading to build foundational skills. Our math curriculum utilizes the Illustrative Math program, which empowers students to build on what they know about math to infer solutions to problems and represent their thinking in multiple ways.

PROGRESS REPORTING

Students are tested throughout the year to make sure they are learning, so we don't just rely on state tests to know if they are on-track. To track student reading proficiency and growth, we use iReady ELA and mCLASS DIBELS assessments. Teachers have custom-built dashboards to make this data actionable on a daily and weekly basis. We collect data points on each of our students and families are frequently updated on student progress.
